Charleston-Kanawha Housing staff met with resident council officers on October 30, 2008. Mark Taylor, Executive Director was the meeting moderator and he asked each council to give updates on events in their community.

Lippert Terrace activities included a purse sale, vein screening, craft classes, rummage sale, hot dog sale, soup and cornbread sale, flu shots and computer classes.

Phase II



Phase II, CRH #2, is currently under construction and will create a total of forty-four new units at Orchard Manor, Littlepage Terrace and Washington Manor. Eight units were constructed at Washington Manor, twenty-two at Orchard Manor and fourteen at Littlepage Terrace.

The units pictured above are located beside Washington Manor. Charleston-Kanawha Housing had an open house for residents to tour one of these units on November 14, 2008. These units are almost fully occupied by residents being relocated for phase III of redevelopment which includes demolition of 120 units in Washington Manor and 46 in Littlepage Terrace.

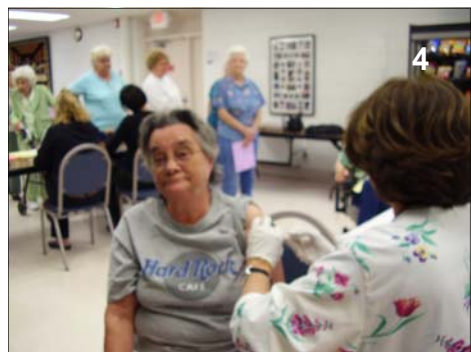
